


Tuiga - A Traditional Samoan Attire

As the owner and CEO of Le Taupou Manaia Academy of Traditional Samoan Dance, Music, and Arts in American Samoa, Samoa, and New Zealand, she is renowned for promoting Samoan culture through fashion, music, and dance.

She aims to showcase the island's beauty and preserve and revive traditional Samoan treasures like the Tuiga Fafau, a three-piece headdress worn by models and Taupou. She wishes for younger generations to continue the tradition of creating these traditional handicrafts.

Tuifaasisina hopes to inspire more artists to share their talents across the Pacific, emphasizing the importance of knowing one's heritage. Her evolving art of music and dance, showcased in her fashion shows, reflects the talents she has passed down through her dance academy.

A highlight of her experience was dressing Miss Pacific Islands, Miss Moemoana Schwenke, in traditional Samoan attire for the Samoan Taualuga. Tuifaasisina feels blessed to still model and dance with her team and cherishes the beautiful spirit of Pacific islanders.
